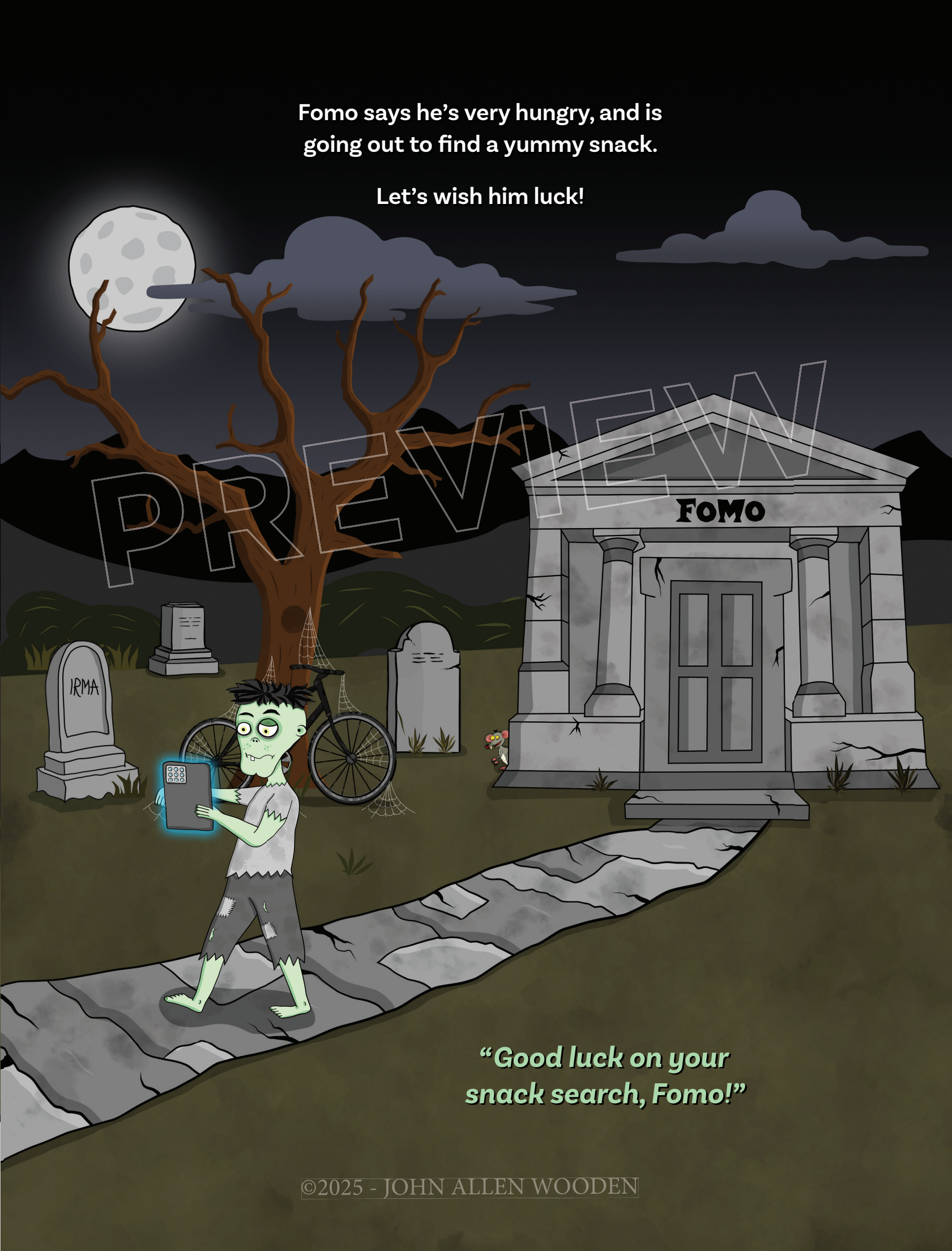
This is Fomo. He’s a nice little zombie who’s always looking at screens. Let’s try to get his attention...

Zowie - is Fomo walking all the way to town? That's very far. Let's help him find some food along the way.

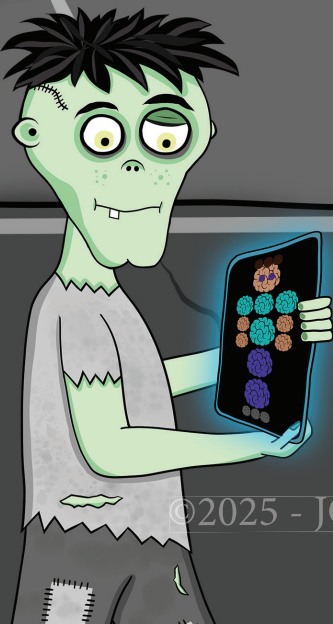
Oh goody - a snack cart! Can Fomo eat a whole footlong with ketchup & mustard? There's only one way to find out...
